


Göta studentkår's statute

Last revised 30-01-2017



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Chapter 1 General

Name and composition	1:1	Göta studentkår is a democratically controlled non-profit association of students at the University of Gothenburg. Göta studentkår is religiously and party-politically independent.
Aim	1:2	The aim of Göta studentkår is to protect, promote and monitor its represented students' interests in educational issues. Göta studentkår shall also protect, promote and monitor its members' interests in social issues affecting its members' study situation.
Registered address	1:3	Göta studentkår's registered office is in Gothenburg
Represented students	1:4	Göta studentkår represents all students at the University of Gothenburg at first-cycle, second-cycle and third-cycle levels within the Faculty of Arts, the Faculty of Science, the Faculty of Social Sciences, the Faculty of Education and the IT Faculty, as well as students at first-cycle, second-cycle and third-cycle levels at the Board for Teacher Education.

Organisation	1:6	Göta studentkår's institutions are: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – The Representative Assembly – The Union Board – The Nomination Committee – The Election Committee – The section boards – The Doctoral Council – The Management Council

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – The Education Council – The Council of Social matters and Student Welfare – Student and doctoral student groups
Delegation of authority	1:7	The Representative Assembly establishes the delegation of authority for the Union's institutions. This details their tasks and authorities.
Financial year	1:8	Göta studentkår's financial year and accounting year and the mandate period for the Delegation and the Board runs from 1 July until 30 June, unless otherwise stated by these statutes.
Authorised signatories	1:9	Two of Göta studentkår's authorised signatories must sign jointly. One of Göta studentkår's authorised signatories must be the Union Chairman. The Union Board appoints additional authorised signatories at constituent board meetings.

Chapter 2 Membership

Membership	2:1	<p>Students who are enrolled and registered for education at the University of Gothenburg and who are included under point 1:4 are entitled to be members of Göta studentkår.</p> <p>A student becomes a member of Göta studentkår by paying the membership fee, set by the Representative Assembly.</p>
Members' rights	2:2	<p>Every member is entitled to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – participate in elections for the Representative Assembly – stand as a candidate for the Representative Assembly, the Union Board, a section board, the Nomination Committee and the Election Committee – stand as a candidate for the student representative positions appointed by Göta studentkår – stand as a candidate for the student representative positions for which Göta studentkår is entitled to nominate candidates – have a question dealt with by a section board or the Representative Assembly – read minutes from the section to which the member belongs, and from Representative Assembly and Union Board meetings

		– take advantage of the benefits and services offered by Göta studentkår
Members' obligations	2:3	Every member is expected to follow these statutes, decisions taken by the Representative Assembly and the rules of procedure for the section to which the member belongs.
Sustaining membership	2:4	Individuals can become sustaining members by paying the sustaining membership fee established by the Representative Assembly. Legal entities that wish to become sustaining members will be decided on in each individual case by the Representative Assembly. Sustaining members do not have any rights or obligations within the Union. Sustaining members are not members of a section.
Resignation	2:5	Members who wish to resign from Göta studentkår must notify the Union of this.
Exclusion	2:6	A member who is guilty of a serious violation of point 2:3 or who opposes the aims of the Union can be excluded. A decision on exclusion will be taken by the Representative Assembly with at least half the Delegation's total number of votes. The decision shall indicate the shortest period of time for which the exclusion is valid. A question of exclusion can be raised by members of the Delegation, a section board or the Union Board. Members who are the subject of a decision on exclusion will be notified of this and are entitled to attend and comment on this matter at the Representative Assembly meeting at which the issue of exclusion will be considered.

Chapter 3 Representative Assembly

The nature of the Representative Assembly	3:1	The Representative Assembly is Göta studentkår's highest decision-making body.
Composition	3:2	The Representative Assembly consists of 21 members, who are appointed by the Union's members by direct election. The Representative Assembly represents members of Göta studentkår. If a member retires from his or her position, a replacement will be appointed in accordance with Göta

		studentkår's electoral system.
Making decisions	3:3	The Representative Assembly makes decisions with at least half the number of approved votes cast, unless otherwise stated in these statutes. In the event of an even number of votes, the issue shall be dealt with again. In the event of an even number of votes on a decision where the issue cannot be postponed, the Union Chairman has the casting vote.
Meetings	3:4	The Representative Assembly meets when convened by the Union Chairman. The Representative Assembly must hold at least two meetings per semester. Before its mandate period begins, a newly-elected Representative Assembly must hold a constituent meeting before the end of April. At a constituent Representative Assembly meeting, no business other than that stated in point 3:5 may be dealt with.
Constituent meetings	3:5	Before the end of April, a newly-elected Representative Assembly must hold a constituent meeting. The following matters must be dealt with ahead of the coming financial year: – Election of: Union Chairman and Chairman of the Board a Vice Union Chairman with responsibility for educational issues, who will also be a member of the Union Board a Vice Union Chairman with responsibility for social issues, who will also be a member of the Union Board two to six other members of the Union Board two internal auditors an authorised financial auditor a chairman for each of the section boards other members of the section boards – Rules of procedure for Representative Assembly meetings – Membership fees – The monthly remuneration amount – Budget

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Operational plan – Decisions about Internal coordination <p>Decisions made by the constituent Delegation meeting come into force on 1 July of that year.</p>
Matters to be dealt with during the autumn	3:6	<p>At a Representative Assembly meeting during the autumn, the following matters shall be dealt with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – election of the Chairman of the Election Committee – election of three to six other members of the Election Committee – election of the Nomination Committee – the Union's assignment of delegation and assignment of responsibilities – annual report – auditor's reports – confirming the income statement and balance sheet – the Union Board's proposal for how to dispose of any surplus or cover any deficit – discharging the previous year's Union Board from liability
Convening meetings	3:7	<p>Notice of meetings shall be sent to the members of the Representative Assembly no later than twenty weekdays before the meeting, and shall contain a preliminary agenda.</p> <p>Documents for the meeting shall be sent to members of the Delegation no later than ten weekdays before the meeting.</p> <p>Notice shall be posted publicly.</p>
Motions	3:8	<p>Members who wish to add an item to the agenda must give notice of this in writing to the Union Chairman no later than fifteen weekdays before the meeting of the Representative Assembly.</p> <p>The Union Board shall issue a statement on motions received by the Representative Assembly.</p>
Additional matters	3:9	<p>Decisions may not be made on issues that have not been circulated.</p>
Right of attendance and right to speak	3:10	<p>The Representative Assembly's meetings are open.</p> <p>All those present at the meeting have the right to speak.</p>

		The members of the Representative Assembly, the Chairman of the Representative Assembly, the Representative Assembly secretary, the Union Board, the Union's auditors, the Nomination Committee and the Election Committee have the permanent right to attend.
The right to submit motions	3:11	Göta studentkår's members, the members of the Representative Assembly, the Union Board, the Union's auditors, the Nomination Committee, the Election Committee and those decided on by the Representative Assembly have the right to submit motions.
The right to vote	3:12	The members of the Representative Assembly have the right to vote. Voting by proxy is not permitted.
Quorum	3:13	A meeting is in quorum if notice has been given in accordance with point 3:7 and at least half of the ordinary members are present at the meeting.
Voting	3:14	As a rule, voting takes place openly, with the exception of personal elections with more than one candidate where secret ballot-voting is always used. A secret ballot vote will also be made at the requests of a member of the Representative Assembly
Personal election	3:15	Individuals are always elected by secret ballot, unless the Representative Assembly unanimously decides otherwise. In order to be elected, more than half the Representative Assembly's valid votes are required. If no candidate receives the stipulated majority, a new round of voting is carried out with all the candidates except the candidate who received the lowest number of votes in the previous round of voting.
Minutes	3:16	Minutes of the Representative Assembly's meetings shall be kept. These minutes shall be confirmed by the serving chairman of the meeting, the meeting secretary and two people elected to confirm the minutes.
Notifying decisions	3:17	Confirmed minutes from Representative Assembly meetings shall be posted publicly no later than three weeks after each Representative meeting.
No-confidence votes	3:18	Representative Assembly can declare that an elected representative does not have the confidence of the Representative Assembly. In order to make such a declaration, more than half of the Representative Assembly's total number of members must sanction

		this. A vote of no confidence will only be dealt with at the request of at least four members of the Representative Assembly.
Cooperation organisations	3:19	Issues relating to Göta studentkår's admission to or withdrawal from other organisations will be decided on by the Representative Assembly with a three quarters majority of the number of approved votes cast.
Prevention from simultaneous membership of the Union Board and the Representative Assembly	3:20	If a member of the Representative Assembly is elected as a member of the Union Board, he or she must resign from his or her place on the Representative Assembly.
Section bias	3.21	If a member of the Representative Assembly is elected as the section chairman or vice-chairman, the member shall resign his place in the Representative Assembly.
Conflicts of private interest	3:22	If a decision can bring particular benefits to a member of the Representative Assembly, the member shall not cast a vote .
Bias	3:23	In the case a member of the Representative Assembly is bias, he/she shall not cast a vote in issue in question. A member of the Representative Assembly may raise the order of another member being bias. If the member being accused of being bias chooses not to lay down his/her vote the Representative Assembly will decide whether the member is bias or not.

Chapter 4 Representative Assembly

Method of election	4:1	The Representative Assembly is elected annually via free, secret, direct and proportional election. The election must have been held and counted by the end of March. Voting can be done at a voting station or via the internet.
Electoral system	4:2	In addition to that which is stated in these statutes, election to the Representative Assembly is governed by Göta studentkår's electoral system. Making changes to the electoral system requires the same decision with a three quarters majority of the number of approved votes cast at two different Delegation meetings with at least thirty weekdays between them.

The right to vote	4:3	Every member who, at the time of voting, can produce valid identification and is a full member. Every member has one vote. Voting by proxy is not permitted.
Eligibility	4:4	Every member is eligible for the Representative Assembly. In order to receive votes for the Representative Assembly, the candidate must be eligible.
Distribution of seats	4:5	Representative Assembly seats will distributed as prescribed by the electoral system. In order for a candidate to obtain a Representative Assembly seat, the candidate or the list must receive at least two approved votes.

Chapter 5 The Union Board

The nature of the Board	5:1	The Union Board is the Union's executive body and the Representative Assembly's agent. The Union Board carries out the immediate administration of the Union's operations in accordance with these statutes, existing governing documents and other decisions made by the Representative Assembly.
Composition	5:2	The Union Board consists of a Union Chairman, two Vice Union Chairmen and other members. The Union Board shall have at least five and no more than nine members. The members of the Union Board must be members of Göta studentkår.
By-election to the Union Board	5:3	If a member of the Union Board retires from his or her position, the Representative Assembly may hold a by-election. The by-election shall be prepared by the incumbent Nomination Committee.
Tasks	5:4	The tasks of the Union Board are to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – plan, coordinate and lead the operations of the Union – prepare matters to be handled by the Representative Assembly, unless the Representative Assembly, has decided that the matter should be prepared in some other way – implement the Representative Assembly's decisions – appoint members to committees and elected representatives to those bodies to which members or elected representative are not chosen by the

		<p>Representative Assembly, or the sections</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – prepare budget proposals for the coming financial year – prepare operational plan proposals for the coming financial year – prepare the Delegation's income statement and balance sheet for the financial year no later than 1 November of the subsequent financial year – act as the employer for the Union's employees – make decisions on the payment of remuneration – appoint authorised signatories – after its mandate period, but no later than 1 November, submit its annual report to the auditors – support the sections in their work – submit proposals for a concretised operational plan for the section to the Representative Assembly the first Representative Assembly meeting of the autumn semester. A concretised operational plan must be based on the operational plan adopted by the constituent Representative Assembly meeting <p>The Union Board may also make decisions that would normally be made by the Representative Assembly, but which cannot be postponed. Any such decisions must be submitted to the Representative Assembly at the next Representative Assembly meeting.</p>
Convening meetings	5:5	<p>The Union Board meets when convened by the Union Chairman. Notice of meetings shall be sent to the members of the Union Board no later than ten weekdays before the meeting. Agendas and other board documents must be circulated no later than three weekdays before the meeting. Notice of meetings shall be posted publicly.</p>
Quorum	5:6	<p>The Board is in quorum when half – but at least four – of the members are present at a meeting.</p>
Making decisions	5:7	<p>The Board makes decisions with at least half the number of approved votes cast. In the event of an even number of votes, the issue shall be dealt with again. If a decision cannot be postponed, the Chairman of the Union Board has the casting vote.</p> <p>If the Board is to be able to make decisions in some other way, this must be governed by the Board's meeting procedure.</p>

The Board's meeting procedure	5:8	<p>At constituent meetings, the Board must decide on a meeting procedure.</p> <p>This meeting procedure must be adopted with at least a three quarters majority of the Board's total number of votes.</p>
The rights of meeting participants	5:9	<p>The members of the Union Board have the right of attendance, the right to speak, the right of initiation and the right to vote at the Union Board's meetings.</p> <p>The Union's auditors have the right of attendance and the right to speak.</p> <p>The right of attendance and the right to speak for others are governed by the Board's meeting procedure.</p> <p>The Board can decide to hold the meeting in part or in full behind closed doors.</p>
Minutes	5:10	<p>Minutes shall be taken by the meeting secretary at the Board's meetings. These minutes shall be confirmed by the chairman of the meeting and at least one person elected to confirm the minutes.</p>
Notifying decisions	5:11	<p>Confirmed minutes from the Board's meetings shall be posted publicly no later than two weeks after the Board meeting in question.</p>
Constituent Board meetings	5:12	<p>The incoming Union Board shall hold a constituent meeting after the Delegation meeting at which the Board was elected has been concluded. The following matters shall be dealt with at this meeting:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – meeting procedure – remuneration – authorised signatories – financial delegation <p>If the constituent Board meeting is held before 1 July, decisions taken at the meeting come into force on 1 July.</p>
The tasks of the Union Chairman	5:13	<p>The tasks of the Union Chairman are to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – prepare, lead and coordinate the work of the Union Board, together with the Vice Union Chairmen – act as the public face of Göta studentkår, together with the Vice Union Chairmen – act as the Union Board's representative on the Management Council

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – convene the meetings of the Management Council – report to the Union Board on the discussions held within the Management Council – Report to the Management Council on the issues prepared by the Union Board that are relevant to the Management Council – otherwise carry out such tasks as governed by the Union Board's delegation of authority
Vice Union Chairman with responsibility for educational issues	5:14	<p>The tasks of the Vice Union Chairman with responsibility for educational issues are to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – prepare, lead and coordinate the work of the Union Board, together with the Union Chairman and the other Vice Union Chairman – act as the public face of Göta studentkår, together with the Union Chairman and the other Vice Union Chairman – take overall responsibility within the work of the Union Board for issues relating to the education of the represented students and the members – act as the Union Board's representative on the Education Council – convene the meetings of the Education Council – report to the Union Board on the discussions held within the Education Council – report to the Education Council on those issues prepared by the Union Board that are relevant to the Education Council – otherwise carry out such tasks as governed by the Union Board's delegation of authority
Vice Union Chairman with responsibility for social issues	5:15	<p>The tasks of the Vice Union Chairman with responsibility for social issues are to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – prepare, lead and coordinate the work of the Union Board, together with the Union Chairman and the other Vice Union Chairman – act as the public face of Göta studentkår, together with the Union Chairman and the other Vice Union Chairman – take overall responsibility within the work of the Union Board for issues relating to members' social situation – act as the Union Board's representative on the Council of Social matters and Student Welfare

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> – convene the meetings of the Council of Social matters and Student Welfare – report to the Union Board on the discussions held within the Council of Social matters and Student Welfare – report to the Council of Social matters and Student Welfare on those issues prepared by the Union Board that are relevant to the Council of Social matters and Student Welfare – otherwise carry out such tasks as governed by the Union Board's delegation of authority
Committees	5:16	<p>The Union Board is entitled to appoint committees in order to prepare and deal with specific issues.</p> <p>The members of these committees will be elected by the Union Board.</p> <p>These committees will be listed in the Union's assignment of delegation and assignment of responsibilities.</p> <p>For each committee, the Board shall issue instructions governing the operations of that committee.</p>
Prevention from simultaneous membership of the Union Board and a section board	5:17	<p>A member elected to the Union Board is not eligible for any section board at the same time. Nor is a member of the section board elected to the Union board.</p>

Chapter 6 Sections

The nature of the sections	6:1	<p>All members of Göta studentkår belong to a section. The task of these sections is to monitor education within their individual areas, to engage the Union's members, to encourage the section's students to become members of Göta studentkår, and to appoint the Union's representatives within the section's field of activity. Each section shall encourage its members to stand as candidates and vote in Union elections.</p>
The number of sections and their fields of activity	6:2	<p>Göta studentkår has five sections:</p> <p>The Arts Section, the Social Sciences Section, the Science Section, the IT Section and the Education Section.</p> <p>Each section's field of activity corresponds to the relevant faculty board area or equivalent.</p> <p>The Education Section organises students within the</p>

		Faculty of Education Board's area, as well as students at first- and second-cycle levels within the Education Board for Teacher Education's area.
Section affiliation	6:3	<p>Each member is affiliated with a section within which he or she is studying courses worth the most higher education credits. Students enrolled for an education programme are affiliated with the section with the field of activity that corresponds to the faculty board area or equivalent responsible for the programme.</p> <p>Members studying courses worth an equal number of higher education credits at two sections may choose for themselves which section they wish to be affiliated with.</p>
The section board	6:4	The section board is responsible for the section's operations.
The composition of the section board	6:5	<p>The members of the section board must be members of Göta studentkår.</p> <p>Each section board must consist of at least three people.</p> <p>The members of the section board shall be responsible for educational issues, social issues and finances.</p>
Tasks	6:6	<p>The tasks of the section board are to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – lead the work of the section – represent the section – appoint student representatives within the section's area of operation – appoint the section's representatives for the Management Council, the Education Council and the Council of Social matters and Student Welfare – submit proposals for the Nominating Committee before the second Representative Assembly meeting of the autumn semester – submit at least one proposal for the Election Committee, no later than 1 October – submit an annual report to the Delegation no later than 1 October of the subsequent financial year <p>The section board is accountable to the Delegation for the section's operations and finances.</p>

Chapter 7 Councils

The nature of the councils	7:1	Göta studentkår's councils are bodies for cooperation and consultation between the Union Board and the sections. The Union's councils are: – the Management Council – the Education Council – the Council of Social matters and Student Welfare
Composition	7:2	The councils consist of one member appointed by the Union Board and at least one member appointed by each section board. The Union Board's representative chairs the council.
Convening meetings	7:3	The councils' meetings are convened by the chairman of the relevant council.
The councils' meeting procedure	7:4	Each council must draw up its own meeting procedure.
The Management Council	7:5	The Management Council is a body for cooperation and consultation between the Union Board and the sections on issues relating to overall operations and issues.
The Education Council	7:6	The Education Council is a body for cooperation and consultation between the Union Board and the sections on issues relating to the education of the represented students and members.
The Council of Social matters and Student Welfare	7:7	The Council of Social matters and Student Welfare is a body for cooperation and consultation between the Union Board and the sections on issues relating to members' social situation.

Chapter 8 Student and doctoral student groups

The nature of the student/doctoral student groups	8:1	A student/doctoral student group is an association of members studying within the same department, degree programme, subject or equivalent at one of Göta studentkår's sections.
Tasks	8:2	The aim of a student/doctoral student group is to monitor education for the students it represents and/or arrange social activities for its members and other students.
Composition	8:3	A student/doctoral student group appoints a chairman

		from among its members.
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Chapter 9 The Doctoral Committee

The nature of the Doctoral Committee	9:1	The Doctoral Committee is an association of PhD students who study at the same faculty represented by one of Göta studentkår's sections. The Doctoral Committee are further regulated in the document "Rules for Doctoral Committee"
Tasks	9:2	The purpose of the Doctoral Committee is to conduct education monitoring and to coordinate postgraduate students in the faculty they represent and / or arrange social activities for members and other PhD students, and to nominate PhD students to student representative posts at the faculty, institutional level or equivalent.
Composition	9:3	The Doctoral Committee appoints a chairman from among its members.

Chapter 10 The Nomination Committee

The nature of the Nomination Committee	10:1	The Nomination Committee prepares for all elections held by the Representative Assembly. The Nomination Committee may be tasked by the Delegation or the Union Board with preparing for additional elections.
The composition of the Nomination Committee	10:2	The Nomination Committee consists of six members, and should consist of one member from each section. The Nomination Committee appoints a convener and a deputy convener from among its members.
Meetings	10:3	The Nomination Committee's meetings are convened by the Nomination Committee's convener.
Quorum	10:4	The Nomination Committee is in quorum when the convener or the deputy convener and at least half of the Nomination Committee's members are present. In the event of an even number of votes, the convener has the casting vote.
The tasks of the Nomination Committee	10:5	No later than two weeks before a Representative Assembly meeting at which elections will be held, the Nomination Committee shall submit a full list of names for the elections to be held.

		The Nomination Committee is tasked with submitting proposals for any Board by-elections that need to be held over the course of the year.
Rules of procedure	10:6	The Representative Assembly shall establish rules of procedure for the Nomination Committee.

Chapter 11 Auditing

Financial audit	11:1	Göta studentkår's financial audit shall be carried out by an authorised auditor.
Internal audit	11:2	Operations shall be audited by two internal auditors.
Presenting the auditor's reports	11:3	The financial auditor and the internal auditors must submit separate auditor's reports to the Delegation no later than 15 November following the financial year to which their audits relate. The internal auditors' report must include a statement on discharging the Board from liability. The financial auditor's report must include statements on discharging the Board from liability, confirming the income statement and balance sheet, and the Board's proposal for disposing of any surplus or covering any deficit.
Extraordinary financial audits	11:4	At the request of the Union Board or the Representative Assembly, the financial auditors shall carry out a specific audit of particular administrative aspects.
Extraordinary internal audits	11:5	The internal auditors can carry out a specific audit of an issue at their own initiative or at the request of a Union member.
Following auditing practice	11:6	The auditors must follow good auditing practice.
Prevention from holding other commissions of trust alongside the role of auditor	11:7	Auditors may not hold any other commission of trust within Göta studentkår.
Rules of procedure	11:8	The Representative Assembly shall establish rules of procedure for the internal auditors.

Chapter 12 Union associations

The nature of Union associations	12:1	Societies that are aimed primarily at members or former members of Göta studentkår can apply for the status of
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		Union association. The application process will be decided on by the Representative Assembly, and will be governed by its governing documents.
Requirements in order to be granted the status of Union association	12:2	In order to be granted the status of Union association, the association's statutes must be approved by the Representative Assembly. These regulations must state the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – the aim of the association – what the association's highest decision-making body is – how the association's board is appointed – how changes to the regulations are decided on – that the association will be open to all Göta studentkår members who wish to join
Union associations' rights and obligations	12:3	Union associations' rights and obligations are decided on by the Representative Assembly, and are ruled by its governing documents.
Withdrawal of Union association status	12:4	The Representative Assembly may decide to withdraw the status of Union association if an association's operations or regulations contravene Göta studentkår's aim, these statutes or governing documents applicable to Union associations that have been adopted by the Representative Assembly.

Chapter 13 Amending and interpreting these statutes

Amending these regulations	13:1	Amending these regulations requires the same decision with a three quarters majority of the number of approved votes cast at two different Representative Assembly meetings with at least thirty weekdays between them.
Editorial amendments	13:2	Decisions on editorial amendments may be taken by the Union Board. In the event of a dispute, the Interpretation Committee will determine whether or not an amendment is editorial.
Regulations Interpretation Committee	13:3	Should a dispute arise in relation to these regulations, the matter shall be referred to an Interpretation Committee consisting of the Unions' internal auditors and the Union Chairman. If this committee is unable to

		agree, the interpretation will be decided by voting. When voting, the proposal receiving the support of at least half the total number of votes will be carried.
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Chapter 14 Dissolution

Decision on dissolution	14:1	Dissolving Göta studentkår requires the same decision with a three quarters majority of the number of votes cast at two different Representative Assembly meetings with at least one Union election between them.
The society's assets in the event of dissolution	14:2	In the event that Göta studentkår is dissolved, the Delegation will decide with a three quarters majority of the number of approved votes cast what the organisation's assets should be used for. If the Representative Assembly is unable to reach a decision, the assets will be deposited in a fund for student union-related work.
